ASIA_V 331 – Islam in South Asia, 750-1750

The course covers the history of Islam in South Asia beginning with the first Indo-Islamic interactions through the rise of European colonialism in the eighteenth century. We will consider such topics as the development of Sufi traditions, the political culture of sultanates and empires, material culture and the built environment, and literary and intellectual cultures.

Mode of Delivery: This course will be delivered in a hybrid online format, with synchronous lectures that require attendance and asynchronous activities centered on the collective discussion of course texts.
