JAPN_V 200 Beginning Japanese IIA

This course is designed to develop students' basic communicative competence in speaking, listening to, reading and writing modern Japanese. Emphasis is placed on active command of the language, rather than passive knowledge. The goal is not simply to acquire grammar and vocabulary, but to be able to use Japanese appropriately in various situations. We will focus on developing accuracy and fluency in basic grammatical structures of Japanese and the functional use of language in daily life situations.

By the end of this course, you will have acquired grounding in more complex basic grammar and the essential skills to function in various daily life and social situations. You will also have increased your awareness of the sociolinguistic aspects of the Japanese language. You will be able to handle a variety of topics using more complex structures to describe things, indicate facts, report hearsay and conjecture, and discuss wishes and benefactive acts. You will feel more at ease communicating in unrehearsed contexts.

Credit will be granted for only one of JAPN 200 or JAPN 102 or JAPN 260. Recommended pre-requisite: one of JAPN 101, JAPN 150, JAPN 160. This course is not eligible for Credit/D/Fail grading.

Mode of Delivery: The basic format of this course is lecture, incorporating frequent interactive activities including pair work, group work and discussions. Participation in weekly one-on-two drill sessions is mandatory.
