What do the films East is East and Loins of Punjab have in common? How do representations of South Asian diasporic life in the UK differ from those of SA diasporas in the US and Canada? This course introduces students to films of the South Asian diaspora; we will study key concepts and issues in South Asian Diaspora and Feminist Studies, Cultural Studies and South Asian Film and Media Studies to enhance our understanding of this unique cinema. Exploring the themes of identity, race, gender, sexuality, belonging, home, multiculturalism and transnationalism, the course is organized around weekly film screenings, lectures, critical readings and class discussion.
