JAPN_V 400 - Advanced Modern Japanese: Reading and Writing I

This is a thematic semi-content-based course designed for students who wish to develop linguistic and strategic competencies in reading and writing modern Japanese prose at an advanced level. The selected main texts cover various aspects of Japanese culture while the supplementary reading materials provide background knowledge for the main texts or different perspectives on the themes being studied. It is hoped that through reading interesting, informative and thought-provoking works, students will develop a deeper understanding on aspects of Japanese culture, from a cross-cultural perspective.

Class consists of a combination of lectures, pair work, group activities, and discussions. Students are encouraged to think critically. Although this is a reading and writing course, good listening and speaking skills are also essential for successful performance in this course.

Recommended prerequisites: One of JAPN_V 323, 361 or equivalent.
