## ASIA\_V 398 - Narrative Literature in Premodern India

In this course, we will explore the diverse narrative traditions based on the ancient Indian epic, the Ramayana of Valmiki. We will start with a deep dive into the Ramayana itself. From here, we will examine how the Ramayana was reimagined from the fourth to the sixteenth century across South Asia. Then we will turn toward modern depictions of the Ramayana in literature, film, and art. Through this focused study of the Ramayana tradition across time, place, and media, we will see how ancient narrative traditions still impact and inform the stories that we tell today.
